The Importance of Community Partners

Community Dental is built on helping and strengthening community, especially the underserved the and disadvantaged. We strive to provide affordable and accessible dental care to the 16,000 children and adults we serve, of all backgrounds, with a goal of increasing the quality of life as well as promoting healthy lifestyles. One of our greatest advantages in tackling this objective is our strength and number of partnerships looking to advance the community. Whether through financial support or program partnership, Community Dental is privileged to receive endorsement from many organizations, with whom we are able to provide another element of healthy living and positive life choices to the community.

Our partnership with the Maine Medical Center (MMC) and Tufts University School of Dental Medicine (TUSDM) allows us to participate in the Advanced Education in General Dentistry (AEGD) residency program. This program gives licensed dentists the opportunity to receive an extra year of experiential training in dental centers in Maine and the Boston area. We are privileged to host the Maine component of the AEGD program, keeping valuable dentists in Maine and utilizing their skills as oral care providers. Access to these dentists, eager to improve the community, is crucial to our ability to provide affordable dental care to over 16,000 patients who rely on Community Dental. We look forward to continued success with this partnership.

Community Dental was also active with the Integrated Underserved Learning & Care Collaborative with MMC and the Preble Street Resource Center. We were able to provide approximately \$75,000 worth of treatment, at no cost to predominantly homeless patients or the Collaborative. We highly value these opportunities to make the community stronger, patient by patient, with hopes to encourage followup preventative care and affect positive lifestyle change.



The Importance of Community Partners (continued)

Through our participation with SmilePartners and the Maine Mobile Health Program we have been able to provide care for in-need and vulnerable populations: immigrants, asylum seekers, refugees, and migrant workers. We support both programs, helping to provide access to oral healthcare for patients, as well as providing additional dental education. In this way, we were able to promote consistent oral care to new members of the community, as well as those hoping to overcome the barriers to care experienced by immigrants and refugee population.

Community Dental was equally committed to our partnerships that benefited rural and urban communities of Maine, particularly through the Maine Oral Health Funders (MOHF), the Head Start, and Early Head Start programs. Through grant funds from MOHF, we were one in a coalition of six agencies working to reduce cavities by 10% in children aged zero to nine in the Oxford and Franklin counties. These funds were extended to include pregnant and nursing mothers, in order to establish healthy dental habits before and after birth. It is important to reach the communities we serve at all ages, however, the sooner we can impact the oral health of a population, the better. For a number of years, we have participated in the Dempsey Center's annual oral cancer screening clinic in Lewiston. This has proved to be a great partnership, allowing us to provide oral education, evaluations, referrals, and recommendations, as necessary, to an urban population who may be saved complications later in life by early detection and proper information regarding oral healthcare.

Community Dental relies on its partnerships to facilitate healthy communities, positive lifestyles, as well as provide affordable and accessible health care. We are fortunate to have such enduring and emerging partners in the field to further our mission. Our ability to provide care to both the urban and rural populations of Maine has established us as a dental home for many in need of accessible oral care, while our fortune in partnerships has strengthened the positive impact we have had on the community. Together, we may create stronger, healthier, and more positive communities.
